Blue Bag Door to Door Service

Due to Covid-19 the Village's recycling contractor suspended their recycling pick up service as well as to avoid risk to our employees and reduce community spread of COVID-19, recycling service is suspended until further notice. Residents may choose to store their recyclables until it is safe to collect recyclables again; others may choose to place their recyclables in with their household waste. Either choice is okay. Please withhold placing any recycle bags on the curb and ensure that your bagged household waste fits within your roll out garbage bin.

Council has removed the \$5 recycling charge from monthly utility billing for the months of April, May, June and July.
