




Village of Mannville 2020 ASSESSMENT AND TAX NOTICES

- As per the Municipal Government Act, notice is hereby given that the assessment roll has been prepared for the Village of Mannville and the notices have been sent by mail on May 29, 2020 in the form of a Combined Property Assessment and Tax Notice.
- The assessment roll is open for inspection at the Village Office 5127- 50th Street, by appointment during regular business hours, 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Assessment complaints must be made in writing on the appropriate form to the Clerk of the Assessment Review Board by **August 5, 2020** with the required fee, paid to the Village of Mannville.
- Property taxes are due now. The Village encourages taxpayers to make payments as soon as possible, if able to do so.
- **To avoid penalty**, payment must be made in full on or before **September 30, 2020**
- A 12% penalty will be applied to current taxes outstanding on October 1, 2020.
- A 6% penalty will be applied to all tax arrears on January 1st of each year.

If you are on a monthly payment plan, please contact the Village Office to confirm that your installments are sufficient to ensure your balance is \$0.00 by December 31, 2020.

Penalties will not be applied to those tax roll numbers for which a monthly payment plan agreement is in place and account is current.



Tax Installment Payment Plan ,(TIPP)

Taxpayers may pay taxes on a monthly basis subject to the following conditions:

- The Taxpayer must notify the Village Office of their desire to participate in the program by enrolling in the TIPP Authorization Program.
- For the first five months of the current year the taxpayer shall pay a monthly payment equivalent to one twelfth of the tax based on previous year's tax levy.
- For the last seven months of the year the taxpayer shall make seven monthly payments equivalent to the balance of the tax levy for the current year.

All payments are due in the Village Bank account before the last banking day of each month.

Residents Reminder....

Garbage Carts need to be placed 3 feet (1 meter) from all stationary obstacles, such as vehicles and fences to allow the automated arms sufficient room to grasp cart. All garbage must ***be properly bagged***, tied and placed within the cart. No Loose garbage, grass etc.

Wheels facing in towards curbside.
Do not place garbage on top of the lid.



Back Alley Garbage Collection

Residents can assist public works for the pick-up of grass clippings, small branches, leaves etc. Please ensure branches are neatly piled and in lengths, no longer than **4 feet**.

Maximum weight of bags **40lbs**. If you have to drag your bag its too heavy.
Public works will **NOT** pick-up any construction materials.



Property residents are also reminded to cut side and back alley boulevards.



WHAT PROVINCIAL POLICING COSTS MEAN TO YOUR PROPERTY TAXES

In 2019 the provincial government announced that all municipalities would be expected to pay policing costs to the province beginning in 2020, phased in over a four-year period. These policing costs are to be raised through general municipal property taxes. The province has supplied the following amounts that will be charged to the Village of Mannville for policing in the corresponding years.

Temporarily Suspended Blue Bag Door to Door Service

Due to Covid-19 the Village's recycling contractor suspended their recycling pick up service as well as to avoid risk to our employees and reduce community spread of COVID-19, recycling service is suspended until further notice. Residents may choose to store their recyclables until it is safe to collect recyclables again; others may choose to place their recyclables in with their household waste. Either choice is okay. **Please withhold placing any recycle bags on the curb and ensure that your bagged household waste fits within your roll out garbage bin.**

Council has removed the \$5 recycling charge from monthly utility billing for the months of April, May, June and July.
